AI: Ease < Struggle

AI has become a constant companion for many of us—helping with work, offering advice, even providing friendship through chatbots. For those guiding teenagers, this presents both opportunities and challenges we can navigate together.

ChatGPT is being used to ask for help about friend drama, using AI tutors for school, or work problems. Some have even formed emotional bonds with AI companions that never disagree or have bad days. Sounds perfect, right? But here's the catch: real growth happens through struggle, not shortcuts.

Why It Matters

When AI does the thinking for us—whether in work advice or problem-solving—we miss out on building critical thinking skills. This is especially concerning for young people whose brains are still developing, but we all need that mental exercise. And those "perfect" AI friends? They can teach us that relationships should be effortless, skipping the messy but essential work of empathy, forgiveness, and compromise that shapes mature character.

Spiritually, instant AI answers can replace the sacred space of wrestling with God, waiting in prayer, and sitting with mystery—something we all need, regardless of age. As Proverbs 25:2 reminds us, there's glory in the search itself, not just the answer.

Moving Forward Together

Start conversations with those around you about how they use AI tools and what they use them for. Help them see the difference between AI as a

helpful tutor versus a replacement for their own thinking. Create tech-free zones where face-to-face connection thrives.

Strive for healthy tech habits that create space for time with God. One hour a day, one day a week, one week a month, one month a year, where you put aside the distractions to spend time with our Saviour and Lord

Technology and AI are not going anywhere, so let's learn to be wise, discerning, and good stewards of what God has placed under our control. Remember, we're called to Love God, Love Others, and Make Disciples. It is then important for us to develop healthy boundaries and habits around technology and AI to help us in that.

Thursday, January 29 @ 7pm






Mission Update

Coming to a Church Library Near You!

One of the areas the Missions Team is planning to work on more this next year is providing missions books for our church library. The goal of these books is to share how God is and has worked around the world as well as help individual better know how to pray for those serving at home or on foreign soil. We also hope to include some books for younger readers so that their faith may grow from the testimony of others. Our church does already have some missions books which will get a yellow dot to help you find them more easily. Here are a few to start:



Prayer Patterns by Dan Baetz is the book series that the missions team has been working through this past year. There are 7 books in the series but it is not necessary to read all of them or read them in order. The overall focus is praying for mission advancement. Dan Baetz is the former director for Africa Inland Mission which our friends in North Africa serve with.



Although not a new book, John shares his story of staying in Afghanistan after 9/11. He shares about the devastation of a war-torn country where terror has reigned and the reasons for hope.



Children's Book: This is another book that is not new. It is a fiction story about a boy who travels throughout China learning about the many different people groups. He is shocked to find out that some groups of people do not have Bibles.

There is a glossary, appendix, and phonetic pronunciations included which all enrich the story but may also require some adult assistance to fully understand.
