Update on the Mulamba Family's Refugee Status:

In December 2020, a letter of intent was forwarded to Citizenship and Immigration Canada with the hope of beginning the process of sponsoring the Mulamba family. Four months later approval to proceed was given and the necessary documentation submitted.

Little did we know that a deep silence would break out, lasting three years. However, we are blessed to share that the time of quietness has been broken! On March 26th, the Mulamba family was requested to report to Citizenship and Immigration Canada for fingerprinting (something all refugees from Uganda must do). Ten days later they were notified that they would be given dates for medicals within the next 3 to 4 weeks.

Please continue to pray for the Mulamba family as the process continues. There is still a road to travel, even with this recent progress and encouragement. This does not mean that our desired outcome to have them join us in Winkler is a foregone conclusion. There are many ways it can be derailed. So, we move forward trusting our only source of hope! Please pray with us that one day



we will be able to worship our God together in the pews of Grace Church!
