### From the Lead Team

On April 30<sup>th</sup> the lead team spent a day together getting to know each other better with our four new teammates, and looking at going forward with our vision to Love God, Love Others, and Make Disciples.

One of the questions we had wanted to tackle, and quite frankly an area that we really have not had great clarity on since our Transition, was how to evaluate our outcomes when it came to fulfilling our Vision of: Love God, Love Others and Make Disciples. It can be difficult to measure effectiveness besides looking at numbers (attendance, numerical growth, baptisms, volunteers, etc). Does that really tell you whether you are making disciples or not?

While in discussion we also felt that some additional attention was needed in creating regular opportunities for us as a Covenant Community to focus on and remember the foundation of our faith, drawing closer as a church and becoming more connected as a community of believers. To address this, we felt regular communion was one way we pause to remember our Lord's sacrifice, "do this in remembrance of me". The Lead Team will be serving communion now on June 5<sup>th</sup> and then plan to have a more regular communion schedule starting after our "Kick-off" in September. We also thought it would be a way for the Lead Team to be more visible and to minister to the congregation on Sunday mornings.

Another thing we want is to have a clearer discipleship path for all who attend Grace,

regardless of where they are on their journey with Jesus. Our first action item will be to create a benchmark or starting point for each of us. We determined that step one was a selfassessment of where you are at in the areas of knowing God, loving God, loving others, and making disciples. More information will be coming including a Discipleship Journey Booklet, with questions you can ask yourself, strategies for growth in those areas, developing a personal plan for growth, and opportunities to share progress and challenges. We desire that all who call Grace Church home, will be committed to going on this journey together. We believe that there is a progression that begins with knowing God. As we get to know Him better, we naturally love and trust Him more, we come to love others better as we obey God more, and we make it a priority to make disciples of others. The plan is to kick this off in September and make it the cornerstone of our year together.

As always, thank you for your prayers for the church and especially for us as a Lead Team, we continue to be blessed by you.

### **UGM SANDWICH MINISTRY:**

Even though we've struggled in many ways over the last two years due to the virus the UGM Sandwich Ministry continues to thrive, praise Jesus for that!

We make sandwiches every Saturday morning to be delivered to UGM in Winnipeg and on average 300 sandwiches are sent to them every week.

## Yard Work Day - Saturday, May 28

We've got a lot of projects that need to be done around the church and we need your help. Meet at the church at 9 am and work as long as you are able. Lunch will be provided.

If you are unable to come on the 28<sup>th</sup>, but see a job you'd like to help with, let us know and you can take care of it at your convenience.

#### Gardening in our flower patch

- Weeding
- Bush trimming
- New mulch spread around
- Bring your gardening tools and gloves
- We'll supply the mulch

#### <u>Raking</u>

- Front lawn
- Lawn around the church
- Bring your rakes and gloves

#### Lawn Repairs

- Fill in and smooth ridges
- East side of parking lot and along fire line
- Bring shovels, rakes, wheelbarrow

#### <u>Trim Trees</u>

- Evergreens along Pembina need to trimmed 5-6' from the ground
- Bring chain saws, loppers, truck/trailer to haul branches away

#### Parking Lot Sweeping

 Along sidewalks, sweep up loose gravel and dirt

#### Brick cleaning

- Pressure wash brick
- Requires gas-powered pressure washer and garden hose
- Wash Brick all around the building

#### Touch up Parking Lot lines

#### <u>Picnic Area</u>

- Level ground
- Place patio blocks
- Set up picnic tables

#### Removal of aging cedars

- Several cedars around the building are showing signs of aging and overgrowth and need to be removed
- Will require a skid-steer to pull out

#### Gravel Parking area

- Gravel needs to be smoothed
- Will require appropriate equipment

We recognize that we may not be able to accomplish all these tasks in one day (we've listed the jobs in order of priority), but with enough help we hope to get our church yard looking great.
