Good day Church,

As we approach the Christmas season, do we find ourselves caught up in a flurry of traditions? We shop for gifts, gather around tables with food, and decorate our homes with lights and trees. These are all beautiful things that can bring joy and connection, but I want to ask myself, do they point us toward the true meaning of Christmas, or do they simply fill our schedules and our homes with temporary comforts?

Luke 2:10-11 (NIV) "But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord.'"

Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. It is the announcement that God has come to us in the flesh. We don't stay at the manger, as we have the whole Bible but realize it is the good news that brings great joy, not just for a season, but for eternity!!

I've got to ask, how often do I think of eternity when December countdown comes, in the way I view Christmas? I don't think the customs themselves are wrong. Surely, shopping for gifts, preparing special meals, and gathering with loved ones are all good things, right? They can reflect love, generosity, and fellowship; these are values that Jesus embodies. However, focus on traditions sometimes overshadows the gospel message.

For example, spending hours shopping, stressing for that one right gift can make us forget the true gift that Christmas offers: the gift of Jesus, who

came to redeem and transform our lives. Preparing a feast can be a beautiful time of fellowship, but when it becomes the primary focus, we risk missing the feast that Jesus offers, the feast of grace and salvation. The lights that decorate our homes, while cheerful, are meant to remind us of the light of the world who came to dispel the darkness of sin and hopelessness.

As we celebrate Christmas, let's be intentional about how we connect our traditions with the gospel. Take time to reflect on why Jesus came, to save us from sin and death and to bring us into a right relationship with God. Let every tradition be a stepping stone that leads us back to the gospel truth!

This year, as you shop, as you cook, and as you decorate, make it a time of worship. Let your heart and actions proclaim what the angels declared to the shepherds so long ago.

May your Christmas be full of joy, but more importantly, may it be full of Christ.
