

From the Pastor

A number of people in my circle of pastors, friends etc, are experiencing loss these days. Whether it be through the untimely death of loved ones, having wayward or transitioning children and so on. This has caused me to reflect on the reality of life on earth as a Christian.

Someone once said, "Nothing belongs to us, even the air we breath has to be exhaled". I am grateful for each breath the Lord gives, even though sometimes like Paul, I wouldn't mind if they stopped so I could go to my eternal home. But I am also aware that even my life is not my own. It is given to me to glorify Him.

I remember a story from an African Christian who said, "us North American Christians expect God to bless us. But where I live we have 5 or 6 children, grateful if maybe 2 or 3 will survive. You get upset when the restaurant is full and you have to wait, we are grateful if we get to eat something in the next few days. It's offensive to us when you tell us that if we had more faith our children would survive and we would have plenty of food. We don't trust in God's material blessings" he said, "we trust in Jesus. We trust that God will give us what we absolutely need to survive in this life, or if not this life, in eternity. You doubt him when you don't get everything you want." I was pretty convicted by this faithful person.

God promises to be there with us in our trials, to give comfort and wisdom. To help us find peace and perspective in surrendering to whatever His will may be. Also, to be reminded that this is not our home, and when things are difficult here, the idea is for us to draw closer to Him, recognize we have a better home prepared for us, and be grateful that we haven't gotten what we really deserve as sinful humanity. To cause us to focus our minds on things above, our true home, not on things of earth.

Yet, we are still human, we do still grieve, and have other emotions. And God has promised that we will never be given more than we can handle – in Him, under the power of the Holy Spirit. In our flesh without God, no, but with Him, yes.

But perspective is so important in terms of how these things affect us. Do we pray always for deliverance from difficulty? Nothing wrong with that, but what if it is not God's will to deliver? What if he has another plan for that situation? Then we may actually be praying against His will sometimes.

If we pray only based on our desires, we must be careful not to expect that he will always grant those prayers. And it shouldn't cause us to doubt Him or his goodness. Remember even Jesus' prayer for deliverance in the Garden of Gethsemane was not granted, but he trusted His Father's will.

Can we draw comfort from these truths as Christians, even if these truths in the moments of our grief and hardship, are not terribly comforting to our flesh?
